JANITORIAL BEST PRACTICES



Janitorial Best Practices

Most facilities have enough supplies for a 2-4 week period. With the proposed increase in cleaning and sanitation practices, the recommended stock supply should be at least three months. We've prepared a checklist for you to figure out what supplies you need.

In the likely event that masks remain in high demand, a scarf or cotton fabric may be used as an alternative choice for protection. Washable face masks should be cleaned after each use, and used face masks should be discarded after use.

- Always wear disposable gloves when cleaning
- Wash down areas with soap and water before applying disinfectant
- Comply to disinfectant instructions
- Do NOT mix bleach with other cleansers

Recommendations for a cleaner environment



MAINTENANCE & CLOSETS

Keep sufficient supplies for 3 months.

- Disinfectants
- Concentrate for dispenser systems
- Area specific kits

FLOOR CARE & SANITIZING

Use the right equipment for facility surfaces:

- Floor scrubbers for daily cleaning
- Carpet extractors for soft surfaces
- Steam cleaners for hard to access areas
- Choose the appropriate chemicals



COLOR CODED CLEANING

Use standard color coding to avoid cross contamination.

- Red/white for high risk areas like restrooms
- Yellow for general cleaning areas
- Green for food service areas
- Blue for lower risk common areas

Bathroom Best Practices

You already have the basics for your employee or visitor restrooms, but that will need to change to accommodate new sanitary restrictions. There are many ways you can bring your restroom into a touchless or more hygienic environment.

- Introduce touchless hand dryers, faucets, and flush valves to reduce contact with common bathroom apparatus
- Motion-activated paper towel holders and soap dispensers
- Install multiple drying stations to eliminate crowding around key areas
- Stainless steel urinal screens can help promote safe distancing
- Posted cleaning schedule

The more seamless and touchless the washroom routine, the easier it will be for employees to move through it quickly and safely.

- Identify frequently touched surfaces like refrigerators, microwaves, coffee, and vending machines
- Remove or re-space tables or chairs for social distancing
- Prominent social distancing signage
- Single station carts are ideal for appliances and prep stations to space out areas prone to traffic congestion
- Mobile hand washing units
- Hand washing reminder signs for all employees
- Door stoppers to keep doors propped open

SOCIAL DISTANCING


Reminders to keep your distance.

LOBBIES & COMMON AREAS



Gathering Safely

Your lobby or reception area is the first impression a visitor will have of your company. Not only should they be kept clean and neat, but it's important to set occupancy limits.

- Is it aligned with new distancing and safety regulations?
- Crowd control stanchions or roping can be used in areas that cannot be easily regulated – such as waiting rooms or reception areas
- Designated markings or signage should be prominently placed
- Partitions can be used to create separate areas, and clear plastic barriers can protect receptionists and visitors
- Guest and visitor sign-in should be moved to a separate area away from the receptionist
- Hallways and staircases need safety signs
- Compact or mobile furniture is ideal for creating the right spacing

Use at entry and exit points of the high traffic areas of your facility.

- Entrance doorway
- Exits
- Breakroom
- Bathrooms
- Conference Rooms

MEETING ROOMS

Employees will continue to hold meetings with vendors, customers, and associates.

- Reduce physical attendance by 50%
- Use video conferencing
- Choose larger rooms than needed
- Set regular cleaning schedule



WHITEBOARDS

Can be used to force social distancing

- Clean before and after each use/meeting
- Place between areas/people to ensure safe social distancing
- Keep hand sanitizer close at hand

OUTDOOR & GROUNDS



Outdoor Areas

Large gatherings are a thing of the past now, so take a look at your outdoor areas for employees.

- **Make sure tables and benches are placed for social distancing**
- **Does this equipment have thermoplastic coating?**
- **Outdoor signage listing social distancing protocols**
- **Use barriers and dividers, or consider temporary relocation of items that do not allow for social distancing.**
- **Mobile hand washing units can be placed throughout the grounds as well.**

OUTDOOR TOOLS/EQUIPMENT

Use these to keep your outdoor areas safe and clean.

- **Use sprayers to sanitize large outdoor areas and tools**
- **Pressure washers for deep cleaning**
- **Shared tools should be wiped clean after each use**

WINTER & SUMMER VERSATILITY

Choose tools that can be used for multi-season applications.

- **Salt/fertilizer spreaders**
- **Heavy duty hoses and hose reels**
- **Pressure washers**
- **Heavy duty brooms**



STORAGE

Select outdoor storage that will survive the elements.

- **Plastic storage sheds**
- **Hazmat storage buildings**
- **Sealed lid storage bins/boxes**
- **Specialty finishes and metals that resist rusting and corrosion**

SUPPLY CLOSETS & STORAGE



Storage Rooms/Tool Cribs

Although storage rooms may appear static in exhibition, they necessitate dynamic traffic flow.

- Organize and label tools and equipment
- Add a sign-out sheet or designate an employee to keep track of what is being used and by whom
- Stock a three month supply of gloves, face masks, and safety eyewear
- Post a routine cleaning schedule so it's visible to employees

- Pallet racks for heavy items
- Closed shelving for dust control

WAREHOUSE & LOADING DOCKS



Warehouse Personnel

Warehouse and loading dock personnel must remain vigilant in their practice to ensure sending and receiving loads are transported safely, efficiently, and securely. Protect personnel by establishing safe parameters and borders to keep workers at safe distances without inhibiting daily operations.

- Provide personal protective equipment
- Place hand sanitizer stations, safety signs, and social distancing reminders at entrances and exits
- Post a cleaning schedule with times coordinated at off working hours
- Stock a supply of emergency lighting

SIGNAGE & SAFETY

Additional signs for distancing and safety.

- Forklift spotter lights and signs
- Marking tape
- Floor signs
- Guard rails
- Machine guards



LOADING DOCK

Be safe on the dock.

- Dock lights and fans for truck access
- Dock plates to bridge the gap
- Leather palm gloves
- Heat stress protection products
